This summer South Africa will host soccer's World Cup. Some facts:

The World Cup, traditionally, is the most watched television event, with twice the audience of any other sporting event, such as the Olympics and more than twice the audience of the Super Bowl.

207 nations compete in the World Cup of soccer, more nations than are represented in the United Nations.

There are more than 120 million registered soccer players in the world, and as many again are recreational players, making soccer the most popular game in the world by a very wide margin.

The 1974 World Cup, hosted by Germany, was the first sporting event, indeed, the first event of any kind, televised live to all five continents.

The musical genius, Ludwig Von Beethoven, predicted just prior to his death in 1827, that "in 150 years" his music would command a greater audience than it had in his own lifetime. 147 years later his "Ode to Joy," his musical rendition of Schiller's poem of the same name, was chosen by World Cup officials as the theme song for the 1974 World Cup

"Ode to Joy" was played prior to every game of that contest and became acclaimed, throughout the world, as the "Anthem of Humanity."

Beethoven's prediction was off by three whole years.

His music, especially his Ninth Symphony, especially the Fourth Movement, especially the choral, is a standard feature at Mendocino Soccer Camps.

We shall play it again this summer.
